The San Antonio Bay Partnership is looking for a Conservation Project Manager

<u>Location:</u> The San Antonio Bay/Guadalupe Estuary, located on the Mid-Texas Coast, and including

Calhoun, Victoria, Refugio, and Aransas Counties

Compensation: \$30-\$50 / hour, dependent on experience and education; 10-20 hours per week, flexible

Description:

SABP seeks a part time Project Manager to further the organizations mission of protecting and restoring the San Antonio Bay / Guadalupe Estuary on the mid-Texas Coast. The Project Manager will oversee successful management of assigned SABP projects and programs, including but not limited to habitat conservation, environmental education and outreach, public access, and volunteer coordination. The position may also be responsible for identifying new projects, partnerships, and funding to further the implementation of the <u>SABP Strategic Plan</u>. The position will have the latitude for use of initiative and independent judgment given appropriate communications. The position reports to the Chair of the Board of Director who also functions as the Executive Director and will collaborate with part-time Program Facilitator/Project Manager.

Applicants should be aware that the duties may require working outside the normal business hours and on weekends. Although the services will be performed primarily indoors, the Project Manager duties will require field work subject to south Texas weather conditions. Applicant must possess a valid Texas Driver License and have reliable transportation (mileage will be compensated at standard IRS rates).

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Managing assigned project operations and logistics.
- Soliciting and directing volunteers.
- Reporting results and implementing improvements.
- Developing new projects and requisite funding for potential programs, including programs/projects identified in SABP's Habitat Conservation Plan and/or SABP's Strategic Plan.
- Developing platforms and programs to increase stakeholder interest / involvement and community awareness of SABP's activities, e.g., periodic newsletters and other communications.
- Collaborating with other nonprofits and agencies to advance common goals.

Examples of Current SABP Projects / Programs include:

- Volunteer coordination in support of Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's Abandoned Crab
 Trap Removal Program each February.
- Volunteer coordination for SABP San Antonio Bay Guadalupe Estuary Shorelines Cleanup each September / October.
- o Soliciting funding for Mid-Coast Estuary Education Program which occurs each school year.

- Volunteer coordination for restoration of a Bill Day's Reef for nesting bird habitat.
- Assist in maintenance of paddling trails in Port O'Connor and Seadrift, and development / implementation of the Powderhorn Paddling Trail.
- Supporting SABP's role in Harte Research Institute Bay Report Card project for the San Antonio Bay system.
- Managing SABP's Water for Wildlife project to provide solar powered fresh water sources for Whooping Cranes and migratory waterfowl.
- o Volunteer Coordination for the Mid-Coast Sea Turtle Rescue Program for cold stunned turtles.

Experience & Education Requirements:

- Graduation from a four-year college or university with a degree in a field of science including biology, geology, environmental science, engineering, or another related field. Experience and education may be substituted for one another.
- Possess general knowledge of regional natural resource and conservation issues.
- Highly motivated and self-directed.
- Strong written and oral communication skills, including public speaking skills.
- Excellent organizational skills.
- Flexible and a self-starter; able to manage multiple concurrent projects while also being highly detail oriented.
- Computer literacy in Microsoft Office and Google Earth required.
