



Texas Abandoned Crab Trap Removal Program



Texas ACTRP

- Senate Bill 1410 - Passed during 77th Legislative session (2001)
 - Mandated 10-day closure period in February
- Conducted annually since 2002
 - ~ 12,000 voluntary hours
 - > 3,000 volunteers
 - > 1,000 vessels
 - > 36,000 traps

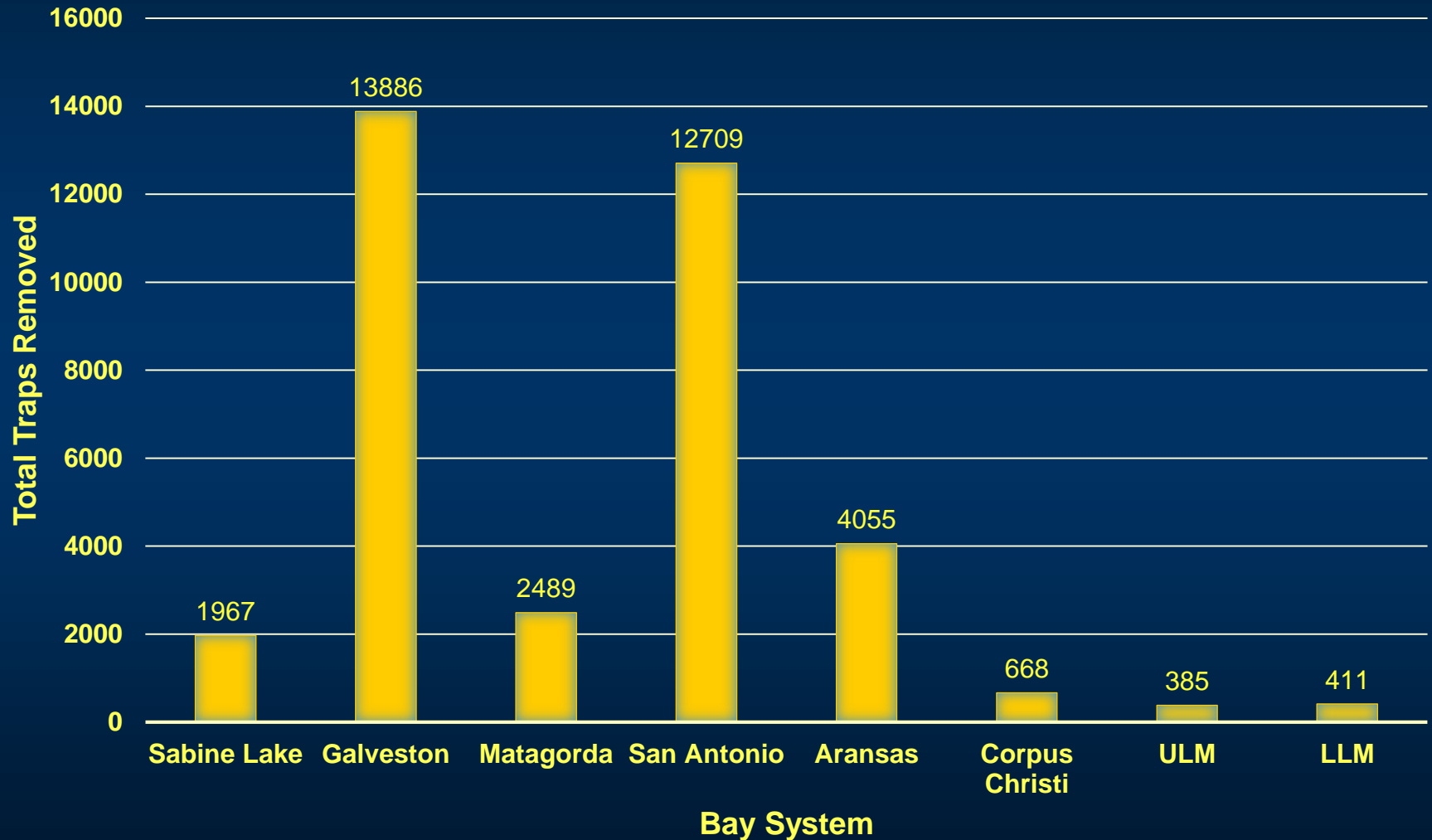


Resource Benefits

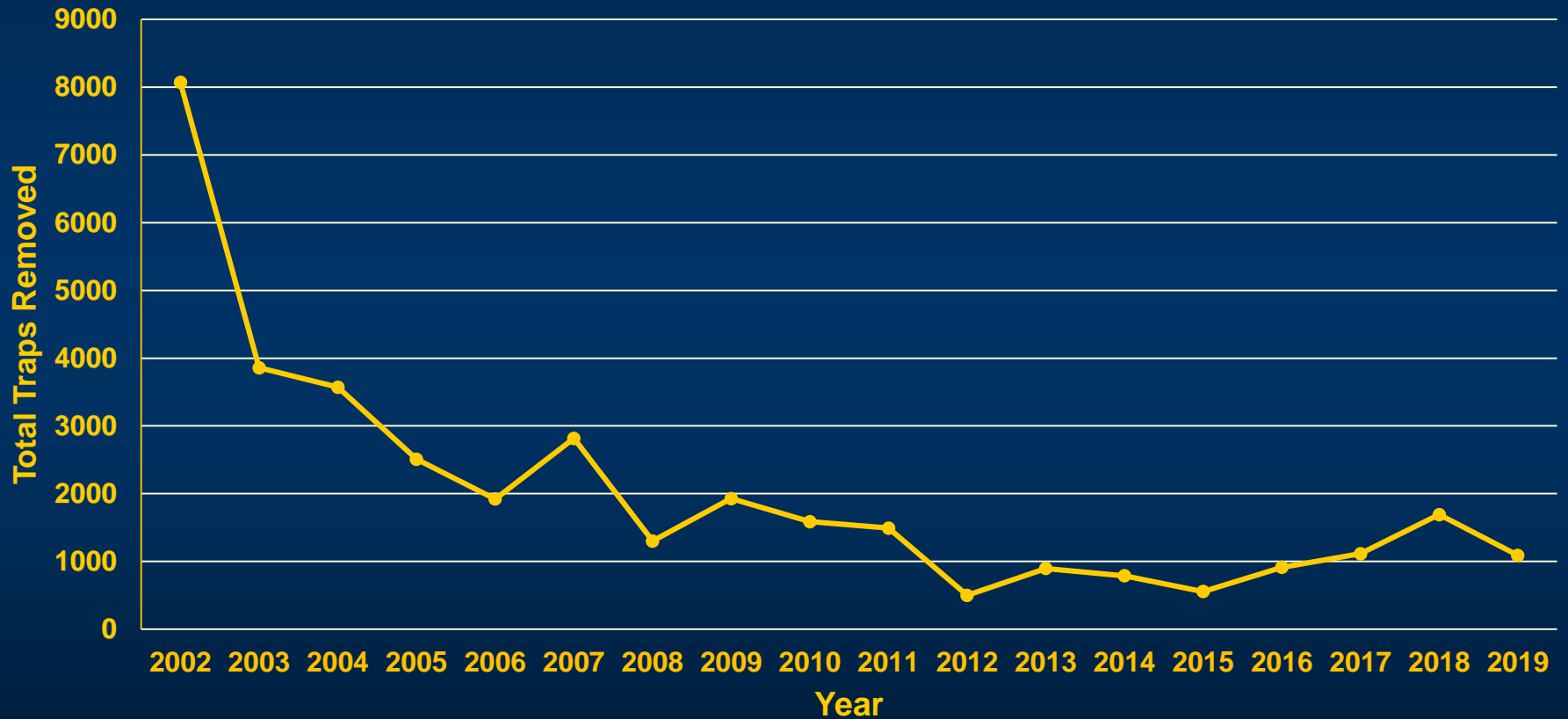
- Reduces “Ghost Fishing”
 - Blue crabs are dominant species followed by stone crab and sheepshead
 - > 500,000 blue crab saved to date
 - Over 40 different species have been freed
- Protects sensitive habitats
- Improves aesthetics



Total Traps Removed by Bay (2002-2019)



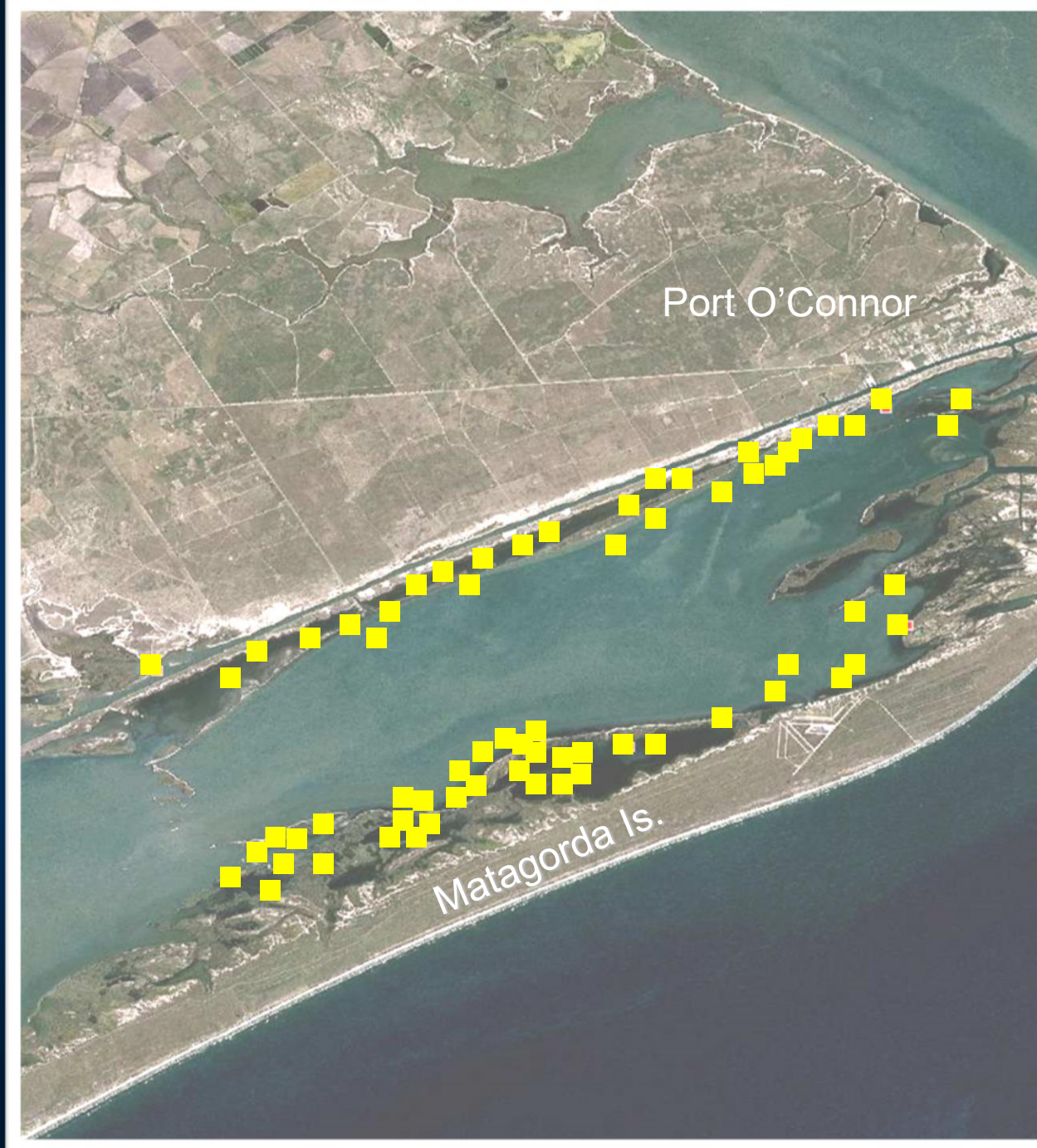
Total Traps Removed Coastwide (2002-2019)

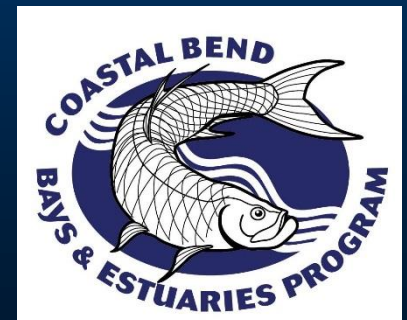

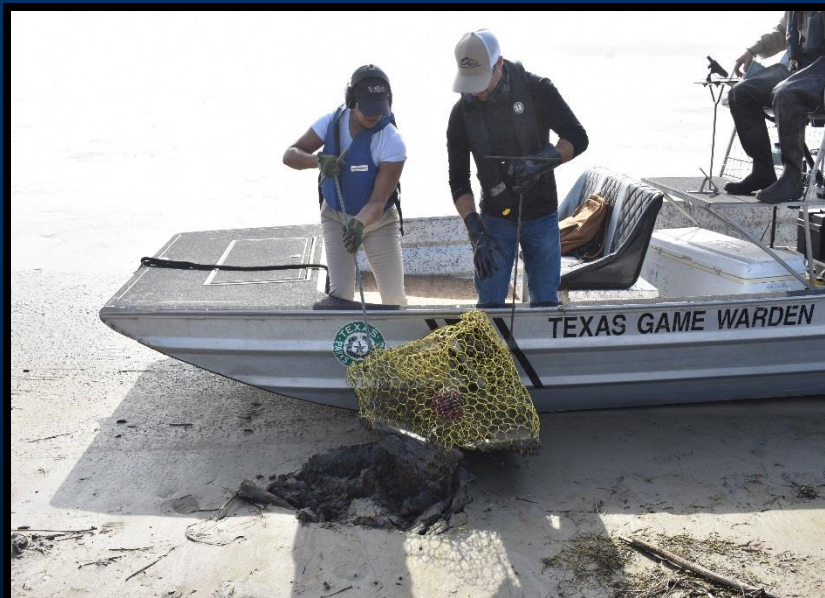
