
Collecting Crab Traps

Removal program got folks out on the bays saving wildlife and making the waters free of debris. An astonishing 1632 traps were removed from Lavaca Bay south to Aransas Bay by 164 people. The use of the Collector app not only provided boat teams with the location of traps spotted through aerial recognizance, but data collected about the traps and the by-catch will help determine root causes to reduce abandoned traps in the future.


